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2022 PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION

Dear Parents,

Over the coming weeks, all students from K to Year 6 will be working on speeches for the Arcadia Public Speaking Competition. Students will be discussing the topics and brainstorming ideas at school, however, they will prepare and rehearse their speeches at home. Students should be prepared to present their speech to their class in the week beginning **Monday**, **May 23** (Week 5).

A student from each year group will be selected to present their speech at the Arcadia Public School 2022 Public Speaking assembly on **Friday, June 3**. The selected speakers from **Years 3 to 6** will represent their school at the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition District Final, (date to be announced). The local finals will be adjudicated by a panel and a winner chosen from the represented schools to proceed to the next round. On the back of this sheet are the success criteria, which have been devised by each Stage. They have worked collaboratively to identify what makes an effective speech. These criteria will be extremely valuable for the students as they prepare their speeches. They will be referred to for self, peer and teacher assessment. Speech preparation should be considered as a part of your child's homework.

Speech Requirements:

- **K to Year 2** 1 -2 minutes **Years 3 and 4** 3 minutes **Years 5 and 6** 4 minutes (going over by 30 seconds is fine)
- All Years 3 to 6 speeches must have a multicultural aspect. This is very important.
- Palm cards are to be used K-6.

Stage 1 Rubric for Public Speaking

Can you write and present an interesting and entertaining speech?

Stage 1 - Success Criteria	On the way	You've made it	Above & beyond
Clear, loud, entertaining voice	Mumbling, quiet voice.	Clear and loud enough.	Loud, clear and expressive – goes up and down – It suits what you are saying.
