

One way we embrace our wide open spaces and fresh air, is through our photography club. The photography club is all about self expression for the children to capture the world through their own lens.




Science Club


Science is a great way for the children to develop their cognitive skills in a way that explores and helps them to understand the world around them. Our science experiments/experiences include.

- Create Ice Cream in a bag experiment.









Any bread bag or wraps pack (not limited to the Wonder brand)


What is a bread tag?

How clean do the bags have to be?

Bread bags should be free from crumbs to ensure no contamination during the recycling process but they do not need to be
