Check-in-Assessment

students in Years 3 to 9. They are mapped to the NSW Syllabuses and National Literacy and Numeracy Learning Progressions. There are two assessments:

- Reading Years 4 and 6, will be held on Monday 7 March
- Numeracy Years 4 and 6, will be held on Tuesday 8 March

Each assessment consists of between 40 to 50 multiple choice questions. We will have access to feedback completion of soon after the

assessment and this will guide differentiated learning Check-in assessments are online assessments for and teaching sprints. The assessment supplements existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. Years 3 and 5 will complete the Check -in assessment later in the year as they have NAPLAN assessment early in Term 2. Please ensure your child (Years 4 and 6) bring a set of working headphones on Monday and Tuesday of next week.



2022 NSW PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE

Arcadia Public School Students will be participating in the 2022 NSW Premier's Reading Challenge. Years 3-6 will be doing this as they did last year. The children can then add to their reading logs at any time. Years K-2 will have their reading Logs completed by Mrs Feely our PRC Coordinator.

The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience quality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely

Some easy to follow instructions are below to remind students how to access the PRC.

Students are required to login to their Student Portal (this can be done from your home computer as well as your child's school computer)

In the search menu type in Premiers Reading Challenge

School Student Travel Term 1 2022



School student travel information for parents and students

School Travel Passes

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass but have not yet applied need to apply or update their details as soon as possible.

In the Opal network, students should travel with a Child/Youth Opal card until they receive their valid School Opal card. If outside Greater Sydney, parents should contact their <u>local bus operator</u> to discuss their travel needs.

New Student Opal cards (including new Term Bus Passes) will be sent to the student's nominated postal address within two weeks of their application being approved.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas will receive their travel pass from their nominated transport operator. It may be issued via their school or be sent directly to them at home. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

Terms of Use

Students using Opal cards must tap on and tap off in line with the Opal terms of use.

All students are required to comply with the <u>Student code of conduct</u>. The code of conduct aims to ensure the safety and well-being of school children and other passengers. It is important that parents ensure their child is aware of this, as failure to comply with the code of conduct can result in a suspension from travel.






